## Persistent and unauthorised absence

Please can we politely remind parents of the importance of good attendance and the positive impact it has on your child's success at school. We know that illness cannot be helped and that there has been a lot of this very nasty bout of 'flu around and this year and hope that its impact is nearing an end.

We have seen a rise in the number of unauthorised absences that we are seeing in school and would urge all parents to use the holidays times for going away whenever possible.

As soon as a child's absence falls

below 90% they fall into a recorded category called persistent absence as it then means that they are missing at least 1/2 a day of school every week—time which is then very difficult to catch up.
