Harbury Heritage - Kids Corner

Chippy says that in and around Harbury there are 35 listed buildings! What is a listed building? I hear you ask.

A building or feature which has special architectural and historic interest.

The older a building is, the more likely it is to be listed. All buildings built before 1700 which survive in anything like their original condition are listed, as are most of those built between 1700 and 1840. Usually a building has to be over 30 years old to be eligible for listing.
