What is our vision?






R.E. explores big questions about life, to find out what people believe and what difference this makes to how they live. We teach R.E. so that pupils can make sense of religion, reflecting on their own ideas and ways of living.

How is R.E. delivered?

R.E. at Harbury is taught using the Warwickshire Agreed Syllabus which is structured around a series of thought provoking Big Questions e.g. *Why do people pray? What does it mean to be a Muslim in Britain today? If God is everywhere, why go to a place of worship?* R.E. at Harbury is delivered in a variety of ways; from storytelling to debates, artistic expression to data collection. In all year groups R.E. units cover the 3 main strands of,

- **Believing:** Religious beliefs, teachings, sources; questions about meaning, purpose and truth.
- **Expressing:** Religious and spiritual forms of expression; questions about identity and diversity.
- **Living:** Religious practices and ways of living; questions about values and commitments.

R.E. at Harbury is closely linked to Collective Worship and our School Values. We use assembly time to follow significant events in the Church Year and reflect on our Christian Values. We are also lucky enough to have fortnightly visits from the Parish Church's Open the Book actors, who bring Bible stories to life for us, and the local vicar.
